



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**  
**BETWEEN**  
**THE KOREA SMART GRID ASSOCIATION**  
**AND**  
**THE SMART GRID AUSTRALIA**

*Whereas*, the Korea Smart Grid Association(KSGA) is an organization created by key industry leaders in Korea to represent Korean private sectors in the arena of smart grid and to contribute to the second development of national economy by promoting the smart grid deployment in Korea;

*Whereas*, the Smart Grid Australia(SGA) is a non-profit, non-partisan alliance dedicated to an enhanced, modernised electric system. Smart Grid Australia is a breakthrough strategy for transforming the nation's electric power grid with advanced communications, automated controls, and other forms of information technology; and

*Whereas*, the SGA and the KSGA (hereinafter "Party" or the "Parties") are jointly interested in increasing the effectiveness of their respective programs in areas of mutual interest.

*Now, Therefore*, the Parties enter into this memorandum of understanding (MOU), agreeing to, whenever possible, share information and work in a collaborative manner to provide leadership in international development of smart grid policies and technologies. The Parties also agree, upon member approval, to become Affiliate Members of their respective organizations.

**ARTICLE 1**  
**SCOPE OF COLLABORATIVE ACTIVITIES**

- A. The Parties may:
1. Appoint and recognize liaisons for helping to coordinate and convey activities between the Parties.
  2. Establish forums for timely and open exchange of information on current and planned activities relevant to the vision described above, involving a broad array of stakeholders.

3. Share information on key topics affecting development and implementation of the vision described above.
- B. The Parties may together create an amendment(s) to this MOU that states other specific activities that can be collaboratively pursued, with appropriate definition of expected outcomes, roles, and responsibilities for each Party. Examples of such activities are:
1. KSGA and the SGA may share success stories on smart grid application both domestically and internationally.
  2. KSGA and the SGA may work together on issues of mutual importance, including the development of policy mechanisms to reduce the cost of smart grid deployment into the grid worldwide.
  3. KSGA and the SGA may review and comment on the other Party's materials of policy, business, or technical nature relevant to international smart grid development issues.


## **ARTICLE 2 GENERAL PROVISIONS**

- A. Nothing contained in this MOU shall grant to either Party the right to make commitment of any kind for or on behalf of any other Party without the prior written consent of that Party.
- B. This MOU in no way restricts either of the Parties from participating in any activity with other public or private agencies, organizations, or individuals.
- C. This MOU is neither a fiscal nor a funds obligation document. Nothing in this MOU authorizes or is intended to obligate the Parties to expend, exchange, or reimburse funds, services, or supplies, or transfer or receive anything of value.
- D. This MOU is strictly for internal management purposes for each of the Parties. Except for the obligation under Sub-Article E of this Article 2, it is not legally enforceable and shall not be construed to create any legal obligation on the part of either Party. This MOU shall not be construed to provide a private right or cause of action for or by any person or entity.
- E. In the course of fulfilling their obligations under this MOU, the Parties may exchange information generated by themselves or by others. Such Information received will be kept confidential.
